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Analysis of second decade of Inter-University tournaments organized by the Inter-University Board of India

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Abstract

Inter-University Board of India played an important role to organize and promote various sports among the university students. In this paper the researcher discuss the historical aspects of the games organized in 1941 to 1950, i.e. second decades of the Inter-University Tournaments organized by the Inter-University Board. In the first decade; the tournaments were started with Athletics, Tennis and Hockey in the year 1940. Here, the research will discuss the development of Inter-University Tournaments as well as analysis the results of the tournaments throughout the decade.

1. Introduction

Inter-University Board of India was formed for the reciprocal interactions among the Indian universities. Mutual recognition of Degrees, Diploma, migration between universities etc. was the main issues behind the establishment of Inter-University Board of India in 1925. In 1928 the "Inter-University Athletic Board" was formed with the approval of Inter-University Board. The board organized some isolated tournaments in different games with different universities, but it was not in regular basis. After a long journey the Inter-University Board of India started Inter-University Tournaments in various in different games in the year 1940-41.

At first the researcher wants to present the list of the universities for the understanding the area of work of the Board. The researcher also present only the universities were established before the Board was formed, except University of Ceylon.

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The membership of the Inter-University Board was open to the universities in the neighboring countries. When the Inter-University Board was formed, Burma at that time was administratively a part of India. So, naturally the University of Rangoon was one of the founding members of the Board. Even in 1948, when Burma broken herself free from the

British Commonwealth; the University of Rangoon decided to continue to be a member of Inter-University Board, though, at that time was national enthusiasm, excitement and pride. The University of Ceylon was joined in the Board in 1943. And in this situation the Inter-University Board was spread in Undivided India (at present India, Pakistan and Bangladesh), Burma (present name is Myanmar), and Ceylon (present name is Srilanka).

2. Method

Since the study is historical type, the researcher would mostly depend upon primary and secondary data available. As primary source the researcher went through the Reports, minutes, Proceedings of AIU.

As secondary source the scholar was of the view to go through various books, journals, periodicals, newspapers and magazines and collect relevant information and try his best to make judicious interpretations on them.

Though all those were men's division. In the decade no tournament has been started for women like the previous decade. The tournaments that started in this decade were:

All the events which was organized in this decade mentioned in the above table. Among them 100 meters dash, 200 meters dash, 400 meters dash, 800 meters dash, 1500 meters dash,

110 meters Hurdles, 400 meters Hurdles, Long Jump, high Jump, Pol Vault, Hop-Step and Jump, Discus Throw, Javelin Throw, short Put and Hammer Throw organized every year.

In the other hand, after starting the 5000 meters dash in the year 1940-41 the event was not organized in 1944-45, 1946-47, 1947-48 and 1948-49. The event was organized 6 times out of 10 times. 4*100 meters Relay was introduced in 1944-45 but in very next year the event was excluded. After that,

the event included again and organized every year. This event was organized 6 times out of 7 times. Again, in 1947-48 the 4*400 meters relay was not organized which was introduced in the year of 1945-46. This event was organized 5 times out of 6.

3.1 Athletics

If we look at the Athletics championship, we found Punjab University achieved championship 5 times and one time runners up. Though, after 1947-48 the Punjab University has not participated in the championship due to the freedom and partition of the country. That is to say, in this decade the Punjab University participated only 6 times, in which they were 5 times champion and 1 time runners up. It proves Punjab University's excellence in this field. After the partition of the country, when the Punjab University did not participated in the Inter-University Athletics Tournament then the other universities were gradually winning. In this decade Madras University were 2 times champion (1943-44 and 1950-51) and two times runners up (1944-45 and 1945-46),

Bombay university also two times champion in 1947-48 and 1948-49 and one time runner up in 1941-42. Ceylon University was one time champion in 1949-50 and one time runner up in 1950-51. Patna in 1942-43, Aligarh in 1946-47 and Calcutta in 1947-48 achieved one time runners up each. East Punjab University which was established after the partition and freedom of India two times runners up in 1948-49 and 1949-50.

From the above discursion and the tables and map clearly shows that in Athletics the dominance of Punjab is undoubtedly much more. Before partition Punjab University of Lahore won championship 5 times and 1 time runners up and after partition newly established East Punjab University was 2 times runners up.

3.2 Cricket

In Inter-University Cricket Tournament Bombay won 8 times out of 10. So, in cricket Undoubtedly Bombay University was the king. Rest of the two times, one time Punjab University (1943-44) and other one was Mysore University won the championship. After Bombay University, Punjab University was the most successful University in Cricket in this decade. Previously mentioned that Punjab University won the title 1 time and 3 times runners up. Here, we have to remember that for the partition of the country from 1947-48 Punjab University did not participated in this tournament any more. So, in this decade Punjab University participated only 6 times and they achieved those success within those time. Calcutta university two times (1948-49 and 1949-50), Madras (1943-44), Aligarh (1946-47), Agra (1947-48), Delhi (1950-51) was runners up one time each. From the above discursion and map shows an All-India competitive nature of Cricket.

3.3 Football

In football Punjab University also has a great success. They was two times champion (1942-43 and 1944-45) and 2 times runners up (1941-42 and 1946-47). Calcutta University also two times champion in 1941-42 and 1950-51 and Aligarh (1945-46), Mysore (1949-50) was one time champion each, and in 1947-48 and 1945-46 was runner up each university respectively. Madras University was the most successful in the Inter-University Football Tournament. They won the title total 3 times in 1946-47, 1947-48 and 1948-49 and one time runners up in 1944-45. Patna University was runners up in 1948-49 and 1949-50, Travancore and Osmania were runners up in 1942-43 and 1950-51 respectively. The map shows that except western Zone football also has an All India competition.

3.4 Hockey

Undoubtedly Punjab University was the best in Hockey. They were three times Champion in 1942-43, 1944-45 and 1946-47. In the other hand, Aligarh (1941-42 & 1945-46) and Osmania (1943-44 & 1950-51) were won the Championship two times each. And Banaras (1947-48), Allahabad (1949-50) and newly formed East Punjab University (1948-49) won the championship once in the decade.

Madras was three times runners up in 1941-42, 1947-48 and 1948-49. Osmania was 2 times runners up in 1942-43 and 1944-45. Delhi (1943-44), Mysore (1945-46), Nagpur (1946-47), Bombay (1949-50) and East Punjab (1950-51) achieved runners up once in the decade. If we look at the map, positions were got from every region of India except from the east. In this case the researcher found an All India competition though the Eastern region failed to took any place in the decade.

3.5 Tennis

In Tennis most successful University was Madras. Madras University was five times champion in 1943-44, 1944-45, 1947-48, 1948-49 and 1950-51 and two times runners up in 1941-42 and 1946-47. Bombay won two times in 1945-46 and 1949-50. In the other hand, Calcutta (1941-42), Lucknow (1942-43) and Punjab (1946-47) Universities were champion once each university. Lucknow (1943-44 & 1947-48) and Punjab (1944-45 & 1945-46) were two times runners up each. Osmania (1942-43), Aligarh (1948-49), Calcutta (1949-50) and East Punjab (1950-51) were runners up once in the decade. From every region, tennis got a place holder, so

therefore can be said that tennis had an all India competitive nature in Inter-University Tournament.

3.6 Swimming

Swimming starts in the year 1943-44 and including the first year in Punjab University won the Championship two times, second time in 1946-47 and one time runners up in 1945-46. Bombay University was three times champion in 1945-46, 1948-49 and 1949-50 and four times runners up in 1943-44, 1944-45, 1946-47 and 1950-51, by which the university established its excellence in swimming in this decade. In the other hand, Calcutta University won two times in 1944-45 and 1950-51, Madras (1948-49) and Ceylon (1949-50) were runners up one time each.

3.7 Wrestling

Wrestling started in 1947-48 and Allahabad University was the champion and Banaras Hindu University was runners up university. After the first year Allahabad University was champion in 1948-49 and runners up in 1950-51. In 1949-50 and 1950-51 newly established East Punjab University was won the title. On the other hand, Lucknow (1948-49) and Poona (1949-50) were runners up once in this decade.

3.8 Volleyball

Volleyball was introduced in the very last year of the decade, where East Punjab University was champion and Madras University was the runners up.

3.9 Basketball

Basketball was started in 1947-48 and Mysore was the first champion and Lucknow was the first runners up. After first year; Mysore was runners up two times in 1948-49 and 1950-51. Madras University was champion in 1948-49 and runners up in 1949-50. In the other hand, East Punjab University won the title in 1949-50 and 1950-51.

3.10 Badminton

Badminton was introduced in 1948-49, where, Bombay University was the champion and Lucknow University was the runners up. Next, Bombay University won the title ones again in 1950-51 and runners up in 1949-50. In 1949-50, Calcutta University was the champion university; on the other hand, Lucknow University was two times runners up in 1948-49 and 1950-51.

3.11 Boxing

Boxing tournament was started in 1950-51, where Ceylon University was the champion and Madras University the runners up.

4. Conclusions on Inter University tournaments and competitions organized in 2nd decade:

1. Athletics, cricket, hockey, and tennis are organized every year in this decade. On the other hand, football was not organized in the year 1943-44. Which means, 1 time was not organized among ten years.
2. The swimming started in the year 1943-44 was not held in the year 1947-48. That is, in the 8 years after the start of the tournament only 1 year the tournament was not organized.
3. Boxing and wrestling tournaments were not held in the next two years, ie, 1948-49 and 1949-50 years after being organized in the year 1947-48. Again both of the tournaments were organized in 1950-51.

4. On the other hand, after starting the Basketball tournament in 1947-48 and Badminton in 1948-49 both the tournaments were organized regularly. In last year of the decade in 1950-51 the Inter-University Volleyball Tournament was introduced.

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
